Rebecca 23 experienced a brain haemorrhage, which led to catastrophic brain damage and now has severe and complex needs requiring 24 hour care. Rebecca is from a remote part of Scotland and has been in hospital for a year. Rebecca's family are keen to care for her at home, as they do not want her going into a residential unit. It has not been possible to identify providers who can accommodate this level of care due to the remoteness of where the family live. In light of this, Rebecca's mother has advised she is willing to be Rebecca's carer, however, will have to give up her full time employment. She has been informed that the Local Authority may consider providing the family with a direct payment to employ a family member. Rebecca lives with her mother, father, and three older brothers. The family were known to the social work department previously in light of an allegation that Rebecca's 25 year old brother had sexually assaulted a 15 year old girl when he was 17. At this time, the family were reluctant to have any social work involvement and were adamant the young woman in question was "just trying to cause trouble for the family."
